## **Committee Reports**

Mission Committee: The Mission Committee met on August 16th at 7:00 pm with 5 members present and Pastor Wayne as guest. Pastor Wayne had attended the NALC convocation as a Ministry Agent of the NALC and made quite a few new connections. Pastor Wayne will be visiting 2 NALC churches in Minnesota and will be speaking about the Tanzania Orphanage and Outreach Ministry at both. The dates for him to visit and speak are September 23rd and September 24th. We are still awaiting on the decision of the grant that was submitted and received by Trinity Lutheran Church in Ashland, Ohio. They will have a congregational vote sometime this fall to decide who the recipients of the grant will be. One Plus God ministries is working with the NALC to get Tunsubilege and Ndumieshi (social worker and evangelist) recognized as Global Workers. Morgan Lambert (maiden name is Horn) is from the New Hampshire, Ohio area and is now working and training with One Plus God ministries. The Mission Committee all agreed that Morgan could participate in the Mission meetings representing OPG and possibly join the Mission trip to Tanzania in 2024 if it works out for her. Pastor Wayne will still be heavily involved in our ministry, but is getting busier and busier, and since Morgan is from the area it is a good idea for her to get familiar with our Tanzania ministry so that she can help publicize and grow it. Morgan does have her Bachelors in Psychology and is a professor at Rhodes State College. Details are being worked out for the 2024 Tanzania mission trip and the final price has been confirmed to \$4,300 per person. The finalized itinerary and payment schedules should come out in the next couple of weeks. Once we have these details we will send out the information to those interested in attending. From Grace Lutheran Church we have at least 8 interested and any others are still welcome to join. The meeting ended with prayer by Greg Woolley. Submitted by Julie Klopfenstein

Rick Russell is ready for the choir to return to practice and sharing their talents during worship at the 8:00 A.M. service. The first choir practice is scheduled for September 6th, with singing during the September 10<sup>th</sup> worship service. Praise band will have their first practice of the fall season on August 24th. Summer worship was discussed, and things went well, however there has been some discussion as to how to bring the congregation a little closer to the shelter house where the Pastors and the sound equipment is set up. With shade trees being a little distance from the shelter house, some people are feeling a little disconnected from the service as people don't wish to sit out in the hot sun. The Worship Committee and CAC are open to suggestions as to how to accomplish this. The services for the rest of the year were then discussed. Rally Day is scheduled for Sunday August 27th with an indoor service. The service will be blended with traditional and contemporary music. There will be a carry-in dinner immediately following the service, upstairs in the fellowship hall. The theme for Rally Day is "Upon the Solid Rock", as the Sunday School children will be painting rocks with scripture verses on them to be given to others in leu of releasing balloons. September 10 a member of the Gideons will be at both service for a temple talk, and Ethan Zimmerman who is currently in seminary, will give the message.

October 15 is Thankoffering Sunday, and the Women of the church will lead both services.

November 5th is All Saints Day

November 22<sup>nd</sup> Grace will host the community Thanksgiving Eve service at 7:00 P.M.

December 25<sup>th</sup> Christmas morning service will be at 9:00 A.M. We are still in need of people to help with the AV department. Pastor Shelly will check with the new confirmation students to see if any of them would be willing to help on Sundays with recording and running the sound system.


