The Christian Church recognizes "The Great Commission" as being central to our faith lives. This commission is given by Jesus to the disciples and the entire church just before his ascension. It gives us God's direction for our lives. It is found in Matthew 28:19-20.

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey all that I have commanded you. And behold I am with you always to the end of the ages."

We understand that this commission is for all of Jesus' followers. We as the people of Grace Lutheran Church are to be disciples, make disciples, teach God's Word, and point others to Jesus just as the Holy Spirit points us to Jesus as the Way the Truth and the Life. Pastor David Wendel, the NALC Bishop's Assistant for Ministry and Ecumenism, has been visiting congregations throughout North America, about 30 so far. He has been helping NALC congregations to take a refreshed look (though I was blind, now I see) at potential opportunities for outreach and mission in our own communities and beyond. This project which Pastor Wendel facilitates is called a "Fresh Eyes for Mission Summit". To prepare for his on-site visit with us the CAC did some pre-work which gave him background information on our church and local area. He used a computer program called Mapdash to give the CAC demographic information about our community. On site Pastor Wendel then spent the weekend with us facilitating conversation and discussion among 20+ leaders of the congregation as to the capacity for outreach in our local area and drawing together the vision that the Lord has for this congregation and its future as the body of Christ in the Jackson Center area.

We spent Friday morning June 23rd touring the area within a 15-minute drive of Jackson Center so that Pastor Wendel could see the surrounding community and other local congregations. Friday night we talked about the current reality at Grace Lutheran and the community makeup. Saturday morning was spent looking at our potential capacity for ministry. In the afternoon, we worked at developing new vision points and action steps to reach out and share Jesus with the people around us. We'll share more about this at the July congregational meeting the 16th and in upcoming newsletters. We'll be sharing and praying along the way as Jesus continues to invite us to reach out in His name to draw each person closer to Jesus and His Life.

June 7, 2023

Vice President, Seth Regula called the meeting to order. The following members were present: Seth Regula, Pastor Shelly, Pastor Bert, Garrett Serr, Scott Klopfenstein, Bert Regula, Matt Kohler, Roger Detrick and Marcia Davis.

Garrett Serr offered devotions focusing on the impact Phil 4:13 and John 3:16 had in regard to Tim Tebow and the sports world. While we may not be as notable as a sports figure, we can still have an impact by sharing God's word with others.

David Wendel, of the NALC staff, joined the group in a ZOOM call where he discussed demographic information gathered in preparation for his visit to Grace to facilitate "Fresh Eyes Summit". This is a project offered to NALC congregations to assist in growth and development of service and mission. The sessions involved in this project are scheduled to be Friday, June 23 and Saturday, June 24, 2023. The group unanimously agreed on the importance for ALL members to be aware of the sessions and encouraged to attend. Information will be included in the weekly bulletin, emails and by word of mouth. It is essential to have a representation from all age groups and communities in order to develop an action plan for the future of Grace.

Old Business:

- Scott Klopfenstein moved, seconded by Matt Kohler to have out-going CAC members, Seth Regula and Marcia Davis serve as a nominating committee for the upcoming election for CAC members. Motion carried.
- A vote to approve Kendall Hilbun's request for a camp scholarship was held on-line due to the date the camp commenced. All were in favor of her request.
- Three delegates are needed to represent our church at the NALC convention. Both pastor's fees are covered. One delegate from our church will be eligible to receive a \$500 scholarship to attend. The group gave suggestions for pastors to contact in regard to attending as representatives of Grace.
- The Fresh Eyes Summit agenda was discussed. David Wendel, NALC representative will be here June 22-25 to facilitate this project. He will tour the area on Friday, June 23 during the day. Friday evening the congregation and the CAC members are invited to be present for a presentation on the demographic information. Pizza will be available to all who attend. Saturday, after a light breakfast, the congregation and CAC will be invited to participate in developing goals and an action plan for the capacity of mission for Grace church. The WOC will serve a light lunch. Sunday, Pastor Wendel will do the sermon for both services. Discussion on various ways to inform the congregation and encourage participation followed.
- Matt Kohler reported Pat Shuff has been consulted and will be reviewing the current computer, internet and website being used. He will make recommendations regarding improving and updating needed.

New Business:

- CAC was debriefed on the Growing Community Through Faith event. Positive attendance and feedback suggested this event should be explored for future.
- Bert Regula moved, seconded by Scott Klopfenstein to donate \$250 for the Christian Music Concert being held July 29, 2023 at the Shelby County Fair. Motion carried.
- Discussion was held regarding offering an NALC seminary scholarship. More information will be provided at a later meeting.
- The community foundation is offering matching funds for particular projects. The Endowment Committee and pastors will be involved in continued discussions.

Committee Reports:

Choice: Tanya Hinegardner- The Choice Committee met on May 10, 2023. The minutes were read from the last meeting on Febru-

ary 8, 2023, and approved by Traci Myers and Jodi Dickman. The treasurer's report was read and as follows: May 1, 2023 balance was \$8,989.74, deposits made in 2023 so far total \$879.00, the balance left to spend in 2023 is \$1,578.00. The committee agreed to donate \$100.00 to the Community Faith Night Concert and was approved by Tanya Hinegardner & Traci Myers. We also agreed to donate a \$200.00 gift card for gas for one of our members on the prayer list. We closed with the Lord's Prayer. The next meeting will be on August 9th at 6:00 p.m.

Endowment: Matt Kohler- No report.

Friendship: Marcia Davis- Lists for student interests have been given to eligible students' parents. The children will be paired up with spiritual mentors' as soon as all lists are returned. Three have already been returned and assignments made. Awaiting others.

Lay/Witness: Bert Regula- Planning for "Picnic in the Park" on June 11, 2023.

Youth: Garrett Serr- Picnic table update – Frames were donated, but needed some work done to them. That work is almost done, and once completed a date will be set for the Luther League, and for anyone in the Congregation, that would want to help stain the wood and put the tables together.

Worship: Seth Regula- No report received.

Education: John Pence & Marcia Davis- The Education Committee met on May 8, 2023 with Lori Wiswell, Pastor Shelly, Becky Copeland, Darlene Woolley, Bonnie Kauffman, Joyce Regula, Brandt Mann, Doug Hinegardner and Abby Pence present. Doug opened with prayer. Financial report was approved; January through April had an income of 1,282.55 and \$526.99 in expenses. Secretary's report was reviewed and approved. Becky provided a Sunday school update that the Sunday school has a couple of weeks left before switching to summer curriculum. Summer Sunday school will start on May 28 and run through August 20. We are looking for a new high school teacher; please reach out to Pastor Shelly, Brandt or Doug if interested. Pastor Shelly reported that Catechism had five students confirmed on May 7, 2023. Adult Sunday school finished the study of Revelations chapters 1-3. Next will be the office of the keys. Adult Sunday school will be meeting upstairs this summer. Gospel Gang is finished for the summer; they studied the Lord's Prayer this year. Erin Stinebaugh plans to order VBS postcards again this year and with the help of volunteers, the postcards will be passed out during the Community Days parade as well as the Picnic in the Park on June 11. VBS had a large response of pre-registering thanks to the QR code provided on the postcards. Cradle Roll received their new materials from Spark Publishing. They currently have five enrolled in Cradle Roll. Rally Day will take place on August 27. Doug and Pastor Shelly will begin updating and revising the Sunday school constitution. Next meeting will be August 13, 2023 at 5:30pm. The meeting closed with prayer.

One Plus God did submit an application to the NALC to be accredited as a "ministry partner" of the NALC, with Tunsubilege and Ndumieshi (social worker and evangelist) as global workers. Pastor Wayne just found out today that OPG has been accepted as a "ministry partner" with the NALC. Tunsubilege and Ndumieshi sent their annual reports to us. There are tons of awesome information about the outreach ministry in the villages that they are conducting, such as education given to the people, church attendance with new believers, and the positive impact it has had on the village people. Pastor Wayne has been invited to the NALC convocation in Oklahoma at the beginning of August. He is going to do what he can to try and attend, as this is great exposure for the Orphanage and Outreach ministry as well as for One Plus God. There is a grant from the Trinity Lutheran Church in Ashland, Ohio that Pastor Wayne found out about. Applications are due on August 15th. Pastor Wayne and the mission committee have discussed the application information and the parameters of it. Pastor Wayne will work on the application in the next several weeks so it is ready by August 15th. The Mission trip to Tanzania in 2024 was discussed as there are at least 10 individuals interested in going. We need to get the group together to discuss any fundraising ideas that they want to pursue. There are 13 individuals that have signed up for the \$50 a month challenge. We are only one spot away from reaching our goal of 14 individuals giving to this challenge! Very exciting and we thank everyone for their continued support! Pastor Bert ended with prayer.

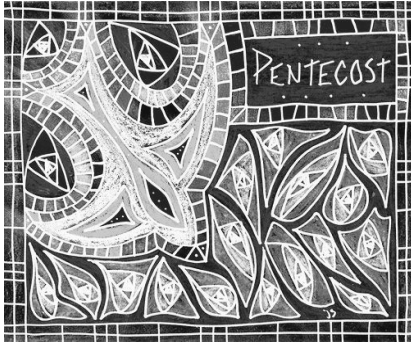

Seasonal of Pentecost

The general tone for worship in the season of Pentecost, particularly during the summer months, is that of growth and flourishing. This season of the liturgical year is a time for focusing on growing in discipleship, deepening our relationship with God, and faithful obedience in following Jesus Christ. The long season of green Sundays is often referred to as "Ordinary Time." The word "ordinary" connotes the designation of Sundays by ordinal numbers rather than special names.

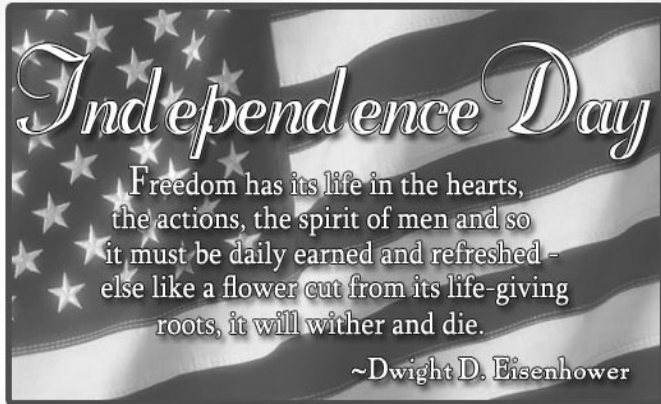
