Strong in the Word of God

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. ¹¹ Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. ¹² For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, ¹⁵ and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; ¹⁷ and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." Ephesians 6:10-17

These were God's words to us throughout our week of Vacation Bible School in July. We sang them, memorized them, lived them. It was an exciting week standing strong in God's Word of Truth as Keepers of God's Kingdom. Throughout the week, 96 youth and 53 volunteers gathered to hear God's Truth of Jesus, sing His Truth, play games, eat yummy snacks that reminded us of God's Truth, participated in science projects that showed us God's Word in action, and crafted fun items to remind us of God's Word to us in Jesus. The spiritual battle that each of us face is real every day whether we are young, older or in-between. God's eternal Kingdom is present to us in Jesus every day as our strength. But the evil spiritual realm seeks to deceive and destroy and discourage. So, we must stand strong as citizens of God's Kingdom in Jesus.

But how do we stand strong? How do we remain strong in that daily spiritual battle? It is wearing. It is discouraging. It is constant. We grow weary or apathetic or blind to the battle raging around us. Dear friends, note that this is God's Kingdom. He is in control over all heaven and earth. He is the One who supplies the armor for us to remain strong in the battle for weary soldiers of Jesus Christ. These are not weapons of violence or destruction. But the Lord Jesus himself provides each of us with spiritual weapons to fight a spiritual battle raging within and without. But how? With the Word of God, the promises of God, the Righteousness of Jesus Christ. We are weak in our own strength. So, hear God's Word to you. You and I stand strong in Jesus by using, putting on, God's Word to shield and defend us from the lies of the evil one. Are you daily in God's Word? Are you reading your Bible? Are you memorizing Scripture? Are you meditating on one verse, one promise of the Lord who is your Savior? People of the Living God, you are the ones who know the Truth of God, which is Jesus, so that you and I can speak the Truth of God. That is Jesus Christ came to earth to seek and save the lost, the broken, the weak, the sinful, the weary, you and me. Jesus outfits each of us with his Word of Truth, which is God's Word, the Bible as we wear it as armor to stand strong in the spiritual battles we face daily. Jesus has saved you for this battle of Truth (by the way God wins). And together we stand strong in Jesus, no soldier wins the battle alone. So, we gather in worship, in small group studies to hear God's Word for us and to us so that together we may stand strong in the Lord and Truth.

Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church Quarterly Congregational Meeting Minutes July 16, 2023

The July 16, 2023, quarterly congregational meeting was called to order by Vice President Seth Regula. There were 43 members present. Seth opened the meeting with prayer.

The Secretary's report from April 16, 2023, was approved as presented.

Treasurer, Bert Regula, presented the quarterly treasurer's report as well. Receipts for the 2nd quarter totaled \$68,254.33. Expenses for the 2nd quarter totaled \$57,995.75. The balance for the end of the 2nd quarter was \$58,091.41. The year-to-date receipts were \$130,705.21 and the year-to-date expenses were \$126,562.74. Matt Kohler moved and Dennis Weaver seconded a motion to approve the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Old Business:

- Seth reminded everyone that VBS will be July 17th 21st and asked for volunteers to help with VBS. We have 73 children registered to attend. Donations will be going to the Fish Thrift Store in Sidney and they are in need of canned and boxed foods.
- The "Growing Community Through Faith" concert that was held on May 31, 2023, had over 200 in attendance and everyone felt that it was successful and will be under consideration for next year.
- Pastor Bert, Pastor Shelly, Matt Kohler, and Scott Klopfenstein attended the "Ohio Mission Region" Convocation held on May 5th and May 6th. Matt Kohler said that everything with the host church went well. They were able to hear from some seminary students and he said that Grace Lutheran was well represented. The Tanzania project was spoken about and there are more churches that are getting involved. The one disturbing thing was that we are short about 80 pastors. Matt Kohler was elected to serve on the OMR Board.
- Matt Kohler reported that the Endowment committee has plenty of money for the Scholarship Fund.

New Business:

- Pastor Shelly gave us an update on the NALC Convocation on August 9th 11th. One of the agenda items will be the election of a Bishop for a four-year term. There are two candidates that are running and they will take candidates from the floor. Our three delegates are Dick and Linda Jenkins and Joyce Regula. They will bring back information to report to the congregation. The theme is "The Mission of God" with the focus on missionaries. The two young women working for the Tanzania project have been named as global workers in the NALC so they will be receiving support from the NALC.
- Pastor Shelly reported that the "Fresh Eyes Mission Summit" with Rev. David Wendel that was held on June 23rd –

- 25th had over twenty plus participants and she thanked them for attending. Rev. David Wendel preached for us on June 25th. The notes are listed in the back of the church and Pastor Shelly said that she would email them to anyone who was interested.
- Matt Kohler and Marcia Davis are our shepherd guides and will be guiding us through the next steps. Pastor Wendel will meet with the CAC in six months to see how things are going.
- Matt Kohler provided us with information about collecting donations for a Seminarian Scholarship fund and trying to get the student to preach for us before they go back to college.

Pastor Shelly provided the pastor's report. Our website is being redesigned by Pat Shuff with help from Nikki and Pastor Shelly and a new company is being used. The Mission Committee plus One Plus God has put in a grant application from Trinity Lutheran in Ashland for the Tanzanian ministry. On August 20th, Pastor Shelly will be leading worship at Dorothy Love in Sidney and she was looking for participants to help with the service. She asked that the congregation pray for people in the congregation that might have the calling to be a pastor. The audio visual position was not filled. Pastor Shelly and Pastor Bert will have to think about digital ministry. Kent Leininger brought up the NALC daily devotion that you can sign up for and if you are interested, you can contact Pastor Shelly or Kent Leininger. Pastor Shelly thanked us for all the support and encouragement. Tom Schindel asked whether anything else had been discussed from the security meeting we had and Seth suggested that he ask John Pence about it.

There being no further business. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
