Hallelujah! Praise the Lord!

Did your paycheck just make it through the month? Praise the Lord!
Did you just experience a successful surgery? Praise the Lord!
Did you experience the birth of a new baby? Praise the Lord!
Have you received the new life and salvation in Jesus Christ, your Savior and Lord? Hallelujah!

"Praise the Lord" is a spontaneous pouring from your mouth of joy, thanksgiving and praise to God. It is just how we use it in Christian everyday circles. Something good happens, we want to praise God and we express it, "Praise the Lord!"

The phrase actually has lots of history. "Praise the Lord" is the English translation of the Hebrew hallelujah. Which is a two-word phrase hallel jah which means 'you all praise Yahweh' – hallel praise and jah short for Yahweh (the Hebrew name of God – Exodus 3:14). But it is not only a command to a group of people, but a joyous praise in song to boast in God, who He is and what He has done. Twenty-four times in the Psalms, hallelujah is used to give praise to the Lord, most especially in the Hallel Psalms 113-118. The other four times Hallelujah is used in the Bible is in Revelation 19:1-6. In Revelation the word Hallelujah is not translated into English. Using Hallelujah! in its original Hebrew without translation expresses an extreme, extraordinary, over-the-top praise to God. The people were praising Christ for his victory over Satan, the angels were praising, the crowds of people were praising God for His victory through Christ.

Hallelujah has an equivalent in Latin and Greek as alleluia. Alleluia is most often used in our worship liturgy and in choral music to express praise to God. It is often found along with other scripture verses of praise to the Lord, such as "Alleluia, Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" John 6:68. During the more penitent season of Lent, we have put away the use of alleluia, but during this season of Easter it will ring loud and clear. Alleluia, Jesus is risen! Alleluia, Jesus is risen indeed! Praise the Lord! You have Life now and forever with Jesus because of His crucifixion and resurrection! Praise the Lord! You are no longer dead but alive in Christ Jesus! Hallelujah! Our Easter hymns ring with the joyous praise of Christ Jesus, the risen and exalted Lord. Alleluia!!

For what this week will you give the Lord praise? Hallelujah!! For life, praise the Lord!

Doug opened with prayer. Financial report was and approved with a balance of \$13,964.26, Nov-Feb income of \$1,054.76 and \$936.06 in expenses. Secretary's report was reviewed and approved. Becky provided a Sunday school update that the number of students is still lower prior to COVID but varies week to week. Unit 1 of the new curriculum started and they will be recycling some of the Sunday school lessons and materials for next year. Children's bell choir will be playing on Easter Sunday -April 9th at the 8:00 am service and Confirmation Sunday-May 7th at the 10:30 service. Pastor Shelly updated the committee that the catechism finished the study of Baptism and Office of the Keys and is now studying Holy Communion. Adult Sunday school is studying the book of Revelation. Members present were Barb Elsass, Mike & Karen Hecht, Linda Jenkins, Lisa Wright, Susan Ware, and Pastor Bert.

Linda opened the meeting with devotions and prayer. Following Pastor Bert's comments we were off and running with much to do. After some discussion of the program "Laugh Your Way to a Better Marriage", members agreed we need to get the message out that this is a marriage enrichment program geared to all married couples regardless of age or number of years married. We also need to seek suggestions from potential participants concerning a suitable date (or dates) to schedule meeting times. We did set a date for the "Stuff the Truck" event that will be held on October 6-7. More information to follow.

Fritz shared a wealth of information concerning the 2021 Picnic in the Park and guided us in our planning of the 2023 event. We've penciled in June 11th as a possible date and the event will take place in the park behind the church. Members will be contacting groups within the church and community for volunteer participation. We will meet on March 22nd at 5:00pm to

share the results and for further planning.

There being no further business the meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer. Barb Elsass will have devotions. Respectfully submitted by Susan Ware, Secretary Mission Committee: The Mission Committee met on March 15th at 5:30 pm with 7 members present and Pastor Wayne as guest. Pastor Bert led the meeting in prayer. Pastor Bert announced that we received a \$5,000 grant from the NALC, last year we had received \$12,000. We are extremely thankful for this grant money; however, due to the decreased amount we need to make some difficult decisions on where to designate the funds. The committee all agreed that we want to keep the salaries of the social worker, Tuwsubilege, and the evangelist, Ndumieshi. Both have been doing excellent work going out to the remote villages and providing education and sharing Christ. We continue to get reports from them on a routine basis and there are many stories of hope and saving through Christ that are being done in these villages. The initial grant proposal had a request for an assistant evangelist salary, health insurance, along with a motorcycle and gas for traveling to villages. We feel there is a strong need to reach out to even more people of the villages. The committee hopes to set a goal and acquire at least 8 individuals to donate \$50 a month (\$600 a year) to fulfill this request. We want to see if anyone from Grace Lutheran Church would prayerfully consider being a \$50 a month donor, as the need for another evangelist will do even more wonders of God's work! The committee is happy to share the reports of baptisms and new members consistently attending the village churches.

Pastor Wayne will be going to St. John's church in Greenville on April 23 to speak about the Tanzania Ministry, the 2024 mission trip, and see if there is anyone interested in the giving of \$50 a month. Pastor Wayne will also be heading to Wyoming to speak to a church that Pastor Bert connected with while at the NALC conference in Texas. This Pastor, Robb Carr, is excited to have the church hear about the ministry project as well as the 2024 mission trip, as they have been wanting to participate in some sort of missions in Tanzania. Pastor Robb Carr's church has committed to sponsor the student Joshua per communication with Pastor Bert! A men's conference, led by One Plus God ministries, will be held on April 29th at Der Dutchman. Men of Grace are encouraged to attend. The Mission Committee will be hosting the Lent meal on March 29th. We will be serving an Italian meal of spaghetti, bread, salad, green beans, and desserts. Donations will go to the Tanzania Ministry for educational training materials on first aid, nutrition, small business management, and hygiene. The last order of business is to acquire one name that includes the original project of the 24 students/orphans that we sponsor as well as the new project of the evangelism and social worker that go into the remote villages and share the love of Jesus and provide education to the people. We all agreed on the name of "Tanzania Orphanage and Outreach Ministry". This name along with information regarding the ministry will be posted on the NALC website.
