The games of baseball and basketball are about momentum. One moment things are going your team's way, life is good, hits are dropping in the field and bases are made, runs come in; shots through the hoop are adding points to the score. THEN the coach calls a time out or the coach takes out the pitcher and puts in a new fresh one. And the next moment the momentum of the game has changed. Summer offers a change of momentum. The following article relates to the momentum we have in our families.

Shifting your Family's Momentum

Dr. Danny Huerta is Focus on the Family's vice president of the Parenting and Youth department.

"I love the concept of momentum. I was watching a basketball game and I saw the momentum shifting in the game when the coach called a time out. When the team called a team out, the momentum changed.

Then it hit me. Sometimes we need a time out as parents and in our family. I know personally that as a parent, I sometimes need a time out to really pay attention to that momentum inside of me and how that is impacting my family, my perspective.

I need a timeout to change my inner momentum. What does that look like? Colossians 3:16 says, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly."

Have I spent time with my Heavenly Father? In prayer? In His Word?

When we take the time to spend with the Lord, we can be lifegiving towards our families. We can impact the momentum of our families.

It's also good to note where the momentum is going in your own family. Who is directing the momentum? Is it outside influences? Maybe social media, cultural forces or secular influences are dictating the momentum in your family as a whole. Take a timeout from these influences to refocus your family's heart toward God.

Explore what is impacting the momentum of your children on a day-to-day basis. If you see a shift in their attitude or character, maybe something is happening at school or with one of their friends. What has caused that momentum shift in them? Take a timeout to talk to them about it. Tell them that you notice they seem kind of sad or angry and ask them why. Learn about those momentum shifts in your kids and give them encouragement or correction."

The summer months can be a shift in momentum for you personally and for your family as life may slow down a bit. It is a great time to refocus on the Lord's way of life in His Word, in prayer, talking to Jesus and listening how He wants to guide and lead you and your family on a day-to-day basis.

One Plus God submitted the application to the NALC to be accredited as a "ministry partner" of the NALC, with Tunsibilege (social worker) and Ndumieshi (evangelist) as global workers. The NALC will meet sometime in May to consider our application. The Tanzania Orphanage and Outreach Ministry No. 6 newsletter has been sent out to individuals and sponsors. If anyone would

like to receive these that currently are not, please let a committee member know or the church office know and we will add you on the list. Letters received from the kids have gone out to sponsors. Ombeni could not succeed in getting six letters but will keep trying. The kids are all spread out in different schools, so if he is unable to get the letters, he will write a report on how the kids are doing to study his Master's in Education for 18 months and will graduate at the end of 2024. There is a great need for him to have data support at \$55.00 a month. We do have a sponsor that will donate \$165.00 to at least get him by for 3 months and then we can reevaluate funds to see about keeping this going for him. Pastor Wayne has upcoming presentations on the Tanzania ministry: April 23rd at St. Johns Church in Greenville, May 6th at the Lutheran Conference, and May 14th at a Lutheran church in New Castle, Wyoming. Pastor Wayne stated he could speak with those interested in going on the Tanzania trip, answer any questions, discuss setting concrete dates, etc. either before or after the 6:00 pm Mission meeting on Wednesday, May 17th. Julie ended the meeting in prayer.

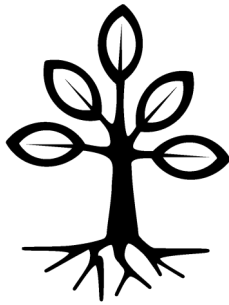

Season Of Pentecost

The general tone for worship in the season of Pentecost, particularly during the summer months, is that of growth and flourishing. The long season of green Sundays is often referred to as "Ordinary Time." The word "ordinary" connotes the designation of Sundays by ordinal numbers rather than special names.

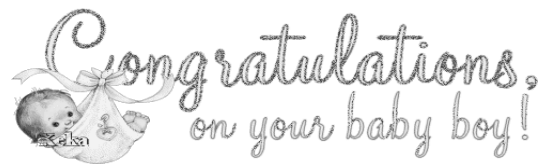
