Choice: Tanya Hinegardner – No report received. Education: John Pence & Marcia Davis - The Education Committee met on February 20, 2023, with Lori Wiswell, Pastor Shelly, Becky Copeland, Jen Woolley, Darlene Woolley, Bonnie Kaufman, Elsa Stengel, Doug Hinegardner, and Abby Pence present. Doug opened with prayer. Financial report was approved with a balance of \$13,964.26, Nov-Feb income of \$1,054.76 and \$939.06 in expenses. Secretary's report was reviewed and approved. Becky provided a Sunday School update that the number of students is still lower prior to COVID but varies week to week. Unit 1 of the new curriculum started and they will be recycling some of the Sunday School lessons and materials for next year. Children's bell choir will be play on Easter Sunday-April 9th at the 8 am service and Confirmation-Sunday-May7th at the 10:30 am service. Pastor Shelly updated the committee that the catechism finished the study of Baptism and Office of the Keys and is now studying Holy Communion. Adult Sunday School is studying the book of Revelation. Adult attendance is up. A Safety Training presentation took place on February 12th. Gospel Gang is studying the Lord's Prayer and are averaging nine students. Vacation bible school will take place July 17 – 21 and the theme this year will be "Keepers of the Kingdom". We will be passing out post cards again during the Community Days parade. Cradle Roll Ministry will be switching materials. The new materials focus on developing rituals and routine with your child. There are currently five children enrolled right now. Grace Lutheran and surrounding churches will be raising money for "Growing Community in Faith" a Christian concert on May 31, 2023. There will be a fundraiser here at Grace "Parents Night Out" on March 31sth. Next meeting will be May 8, 2023, at 6:30 pm. See the bulletin for further details. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. **Endowment:** Matt Kohler – The Endowment Committee met and are awarding 1 \$600 scholarship.

**Friendship:** Marcia Davis – Twelve students have signed up for the mentoring program and there are five mentors that have signed up.

Lay/Witness: Bert Regula – The Picnic in the Park will be held on June 11th at the church shelter house from 3 – 6 pm. **Youth:** Garrett Serr – Gospel Gang has started up again. The Luther League will be meeting on May 7<sup>th</sup> to go bowling. Darrel Klopfenstein has the wood to build the picnic tables. **Worship:** Seth Regula – The Worship Committee met on March 27, 2023 with the following members present: Seth Regula, Rick Russell, Jennifer Woolley, Toni Leininger, Nancy McName, Cheryl Burch, and Pastor Shelly. Pastor Shelly opened the meeting with scripture and prayer. The CAC has again approved outdoor worship for the summer of 2023. The outdoor services will be from June 11<sup>th</sup> to the end of August. The last outdoor service will be on Rally Day Sunday. The Audio-Visual job opening was discussed next. We have only one person apply so far, and they wanted to do the job from their home which is not acceptable. The position again be posted through social media and with the local schools in the general area. Lenten services have been going well and everyone feels the congregation enjoys singing Holden Evening Prayer. Pastor Shelly thanked Seth and Rick for leading the singing. Plans for Palm Sunday and Holy Week were then discussed. The Palms were ordered and arrived. The Crown of Thorns are already installed on the crosses in the vestibules. Pastor Shelly asked for suggestions for persons to ask to help decorate the alter area for Easter. Several names were mentioned, and those people will be contacted to ask for their help. Easter flowers have been ordered this year for Andy's Garden Center. We were not able to specify colors this year, as the suppliers sometimes have difficulties having enough of a particular color. We will commune at the Altar rail on Maundy Thursday. Good Friday, we will again have a Tenebrae service. We will again have two services this year on Easter. Traditional at 8 am, Easter breakfast at 9 am, Sunday School at 9:15 am, and the Praise and Worship service at 10:30 am. The Children's Bell Choir will be joining in on the opening hymn at the 8 am service.

Following are special services that will be taking place in the next several months. The Choir Service will be April 23<sup>rd</sup> at the 8 am service.

There will be a Praise and Worship service led by the Praise

Band at the 10:30 am service on a date to yet to be announced sometime in April or May.

Confirmation Sunday is May  $7^{th}$  and will be at the 10:30 am service.

Recognition of graduating seniors will be on May 14<sup>th</sup> at both services.

Our next meeting will be on August 14 at 7:00 pm.

As there was no other business to be discussed, the meeting was closed with prayer.

**Mission:** Scott Klopfenstein – The Mission Committee net on March 15<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 pm with seven members present and Pastor Wayne as guest. Pastor Bert led the meeting in prayer. Pastor Bert announced that we received a \$5,000 grant from the NALC, last year we had received \$12,000. We are extremely thankful for this grant money; however, due to the decreased amount we need to make some difficult decisions on where to designate the funds. The committee all agreed that we want to keep the salaries of the social worker, Tunsubliege, and the evangelist, Ndumieshi. Both have been doing excellent work going out to the remote villages and providing education and sharing Christ. We continue to get reports form them on a routine basis and there are many stories of hope and saving through Christ that are being done in these villages. The initial grant proposal had a request for an assistant evangelist salary, health insurance, along with a motorcycle and gas for traveling to villages. We feel there is a strong need to reach out to even more people of the villages. The committee hopes to set a goal and acquire at least eight individuals to donate \$50 a month (\$600 a year) to fulfill this request. We want to see if anyone from Grace Lutheran Church would prayerfully consider being a \$50 a month donor, as the need for another evangelist will do even more wonders of God's work! The committee is happy to share the reports of baptisms and new members consistently attending the village churches. Pastor Wayne will be going to St. Johns church in Greenville on April 23<sup>rd</sup> to speak about the Tanzania Ministry, the 2024 mission trip, and see if there is anyone interested in the giving of \$50 a month. Pastor Wayne will also be heading to Wyoming to speak to a church that Pastor Bert connected with while at the NALC conference in Texas. This Pastor, Robb Carr, is excited to have the church hear about the ministry project as well as the 2024 mission trip, as they have been wanting to participate in some sort of missions in Tanzania. Pastor Robb Carr's church has committed to sponsor the student, Joshua Dutchman. Men of Grace are encouraged to attend. The Mission Committee will be hosting the Lent meal on March 29<sup>th</sup>. We will be serving an Italian meal of spaghetti, bread, salad, green beans, and desserts. Donations will go the Tanzania Ministry for educational training materials on first aid, nutrition, small business management, and hygiene. The last order of business is to acquire one name that includes the original project of the 24 students/orphans that we sponsor as well as the new project of the evangelism and social worker that go into the remote villages and share the low of Jesus and provide education to the people. We all agreed on the names of "Tanzania Orphanage and Outreach Ministry". This name along with information regarding the

**\$50.00 A Month Challenge:** The Mission Committee is challenging 14 individuals to give \$50.00 a month to the Tanzania Orphanage and Outreach Ministry. ## NALC Disaster

**Response** is responding to the Rolling Fork Mississippi tornado that was an EF-4, nearly 200 mph winds that devastated Rolling Fork MS and northern MS. A total of 26

## Committee Reports

Mission Committee: The Mission Committee met on April 19, 2023 at 6:00 pm with 3 members present and with Pastor Wayne as guest. Pastor Wayne led the meeting with prayer. One Plus God submitted the application to the NALC to be accredited as a "ministry partner" of the NALC, with Tunsubilege (social worker) and Ndumieshi (evangelist) as global workers. The NALC will meet sometime in May to consider our application. The Tanzania Orphanage and Outreach Ministry No. 6 newsletter has been sent out to individuals and sponsors. If anyone would like to receive these that currently are not, please let a committee member know or the church office know and we will add you on the list. Letters received from the kids have gone out to sponsors. Ombeni could not succeed in getting 6 letters, but will keep trying. The kids are all spread out in different schools, so if he is unable to get the letters, he will write a report on how the kids are doing. Ombeni, who oversees the ministry in Tanzania and a great communication source for OPG / Grace Lutheran Church, is going to study his Master's in Education for 18 months and will graduate at the end of 2024. There is a great need for him to have data support at \$55.00 a month. We do have a sponsor that will donate \$165.00 to at least get him by for 3 months and then we can reevaluate funds to see about keeping this going for him. Pastor Wayne has upcoming presentations on the Tanzania ministry: April 23 at St. Johns Church in Greenville, May 6 at the Lutheran Conference, and May 14<sup>th</sup> at a Lutheran Church in New Castle, Wyoming. Pastor Wayne stated he could speak with those interested in going on the Tanzania trip, answer any guestions, discuss setting concrete dates, etc. either before or after the 6:00 pm Mission Meeting on Wednesday, May 17th.
