Practicing Gratitude

"Oh, thank you! It's perfect!" We hope you heard that often this past month as gifts were given and received. Giving thanks and writing thank you notes is an artform. Words of appreciation and gratitude let the giver know that the gift was received and was a blessing to the recipient. The Bible author James encourages us to give thanks to God, for every perfect gift comes from his hand. (James 1:17). We practice giving thanks to God for all His blessings, gifts, and provision on a daily basis, "O give thanks unto the Lord, for His mercy endures forever."

Or perhaps you heard these words when the gift was opened, "I don't need one of these; this isn't what I wanted." The disappointment is evident in both words and facial expressions. Like I mentioned earlier, words of appreciation and gratitude are words to be practiced. Often in life, we receive unexpected occurrences, events, or items that are not so welcomed. So, it is the apostle Paul who reminds us that we are to give thanks in all circumstances for that is the will of God for us (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18). When we find ourselves in difficult circumstances, we question God to what He was thinking. How could this happen? Where are you, Lord? Yet the Lord encourages us even then to give thanks and to look for the blessings in the situation. We cannot know how the situation may have changed, or what may have occurred, or how the future may have been different. We can only know that the Lord God who created all is omnipotent; He is in charge/control of it all. Even in difficulty the apostle Paul reminds us again that Christ Jesus is working for the good to those who love Him. (Romans 8:28)

So, we practice giving thanks to God for all things, in all circumstances. We practice appreciation and gratitude to the Giver, seeing the good, seeing the blessings, seeing the future with hope, seeing what is good in the gift. We encourage you at the end of each day to give thanks to God for three things received during the day. And then to offer up a "thank you" to God. And if it was a person who blessed you this day, a quick word or note of appreciation and gratitude becomes a blessing to the giver.

The pastors noted 1st English church in Wapakoneta had a large majority first vote (90%) to leave the ELCA and join NACL. More information will follow. Jews for Jesus have contacted the pastors regarding a Communication for Life live stream to be presented from Israel on December 12, 2023.

OLD BUSINESS

- Fresh Eyes is one of the charities included in the Community Foundation funding project for Grace. At present Grace Lutheran Church has a balance of \$4,600+. Matching funds will be added to our total up to \$5,000. These funds will be divided among three projects as determined by the endowment committee.
- Pat Shuff has assisted Pastor Shelly in developing an outline for the church's website. Several suggestions were made for potential persons or agencies who would be able to provide design and updating to the site. Pastor Shelly will make contacts and report back at a future meeting.
- Possibilities for Grace church parking lot to be a campsite for the 2024 April Eclipse were discussed. A local group will be doing site measurements, adding our location to a list and will provide supplies as needed.

NEW BUSINESS

- Grace Lutheran is collaborating with several other local churches to investigate the opportunity to provide LIFEWISE, an off-campus project involving religious education for Jackson Center students. The project would require private funding and parental support. The classes would take place one time per week and potentially be held in Family Life Center. Garrett Serr made a motion to contribute \$150 to the investigation of this project contingent upon approval from the JC school administration and upon at least two other churches contributing \$150 as well. Bert seconded. Motion carried.
- The agenda for the January 21st Congregational meeting was discussed.
- The members of CAC opted to NOT place a paid Christmas ad in the Sidney Daily News based on the limited the fact it is only published two times a week and has diminished subscribers.
- The election results were read. Bert Regula made a motion to accept the election results. Garrett Serr seconded. Motion carried.
- The potential 2024 budget draft was presented. The budget will need to be brought before the new CAC in January and to the congregation for approval at the first meeting in 2024. CAC went into Executive Session to discuss budget issues. The meeting resumed at 6:11 pm.
- It was noted CAC and Sunday School elected officers will be installed on December 17, 2024 at both the early and late services.

They will be wrapping the gifts on 12/10. After shopping, the Luther League went out for pizza together. Gospel Gang Christmas Caroling was a huge success there were 15 youth in attendance to carol.

OH. This grant money must be used specifically to buy land, build, and equip churches in the villages in the Bariadi district. 
