"Living the Good Life"

We attended the NALC Pastors' retreat a few weeks ago. One of the sessions was entitled "Spiritual Health as a Grounding for Ministry in the Church." It was led by Pastor Ken Hohag. We felt that spiritual health isn't just for grounding in ministry. It also equips us for life. He began talking about the importance of prayer, time with the Lord. Though we all recognized it is important, most of us recognized there was room for improvement. We weren't entirely happy with our devotional time with Jesus. In Matthew 11:30 Jesus invites us," Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden and I will give you rest." This spiritual and physical rest is important for our wellbeing. The challenges of life can interfere with our time with Jesus and yet we are blest and better equipped to face life when we have that time. Jesus is inviting you to come to him for the rest, learning and growing time. It is worth it to keep working at taking the time to be renewed and restored by him. Pastor Ken talked about anxiety being free-floating-fear causing fatigue. Time with the Lord helps that free-floating-fear to float away. It gives you strength for the journey.

Pastor Ken Hohag also shared with us his "Personal Survival Guidelines for Sanity." They are based on God's wisdom from his Word for us:

Sleep well, Ps. 127:2, "It is in vain that you rise up early and go late to rest, eating the bread of anxious toil; for he gives to his beloved sleep"

Exercise well, Philippians 3:13-14, "Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

Pray well, Mark 1:35, "And rising early in the morning, while it was still dark, he(Jesus) departed and went out to a desolate place, and there he prayed."

Eat Well, Mt 7:9-11, "Or which of you, if his son asks for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish will give him a serpent? If you then who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in Heaven give good things to those who ask him!"

Play well, Mt 6:25," Therefore, I tell you do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?"

We invite you to join us this month to rest in the Lord, eat well, sleep well, exercise well, pray well, and play. We also invite you to share a Bible verse that encourages you on your journey.



Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church Quarterly Congregational Meeting Minutes January 21, 2024

The January 21, 2024, annual congregational meeting was called to order by President John Pence. There were 45 members present. John opened the meeting with prayer. John welcomed our new CAC members Kent Leininger and Trent Platfoot and thanked our retired CAC members Seth Regula and Roger Detrick.

CAC officers for 2023 were announced: President-John Pence; Vice-President-Matt Kohler; Treasurer-Bert Regula; and Secretary-Tanya Hinegardner.

The Secretary's report from October 15, 2023, was approved as presented. Aaron Klopfenstein moved and Hershel Wright seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Treasurer, Bert Regula, presented the quarterly treasurer's report as well as the year end report. Bert stated that 2023 was a strong year. Receipts for the 4th quarter totaled \$256,921.44. Expenses for 2023 totaled \$239,852.68. The year end balance was \$71,017.70. Total receipts for designated offerings were \$19,807.00. The mutual fund balance for 2023 was \$73,696.54 which includes the balance of the capital improvement fund in the amount of \$23,875.00. Cassi Klopfenstein moved and Meghan Serr seconded a motion to approve the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Matt Kohler gave an update on Fresh Eyes and they are looking for some younger members to be involved. They had two events in 2023.

Matt Kohler also gave an update on Match Day. It was very successful. The congregation donated \$6,145.00 and \$5,000.00 was matched. The money will be divided between Fresh Eyes, Tanzania, and updating the technology in the church office.

John Pence gave an update on the technology and website for the church. Part of the money from Match Day will be to provide new computers and programs for the church office. The goal for the church website is to have to up and running by April 1st.

Bert Regula presented the proposed 2024 budget. There was an increase in the salaries for the pastors, secretary, and janitor. The deduction of \$4,776.00 for the pastors health insurance was designated for the pastors mission trip. Abby Pence moved and Scott Klopfenstein seconded a motion to accept the budget of \$285,141.00 for 2024. Motion carried. This budget will require weekly offerings of \$5,483.48 per week. 87% of this budget will be for current expenses, 7% for building and trustees, and 6% for benevolence.

Matt Kohler gave an update on the Mission Endowment. The balance was \$12,189.00. A balance of \$6,100.00 will be left in the fund and \$6,000.00 will be moved in the savings account for scholarships and local missions. The missions that will be donated to will be voted on at the second quarterly congregational

meeting.

Pastor Bert provided an overview of the Pastor's Report for 2023. He thanked us for the ministry that we have shared in the last year and gave thanks for the opportunity to serve together. The Growing The Community Through Faith group met and would like to have another concert in 2024. Pastor Shelly is working with a steering committee to have Lifewise at our local school for students to have release time for religious study. Lent will begin on February 14th. He also gave an update on the Mission Committee. They are planning a mission trip to Tanzania in June and will be there for a dedication of a church. There will be a pork dinner at the end of February for fundraising and there will be an appreciation dinner on March 3rd for the people that has supported the ministry of Tanzania.

There being no further business. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

The WOC will provide meal for February 28th Lenten services:


