Preparing to Go Home

During the holidays many travel to share time with family. They prepare to go home. And as we prepare for Christmas this year, we live the rituals of the Advent season...to prepare for the coming Christ and preparing to go home to our eternal home. All our Sunday worship readings center on how Jesus is making us ready for our eternal home with the Father. Of course, in preparation, every good event requires a plan.

When preparing to go home we need a plan:

1. Pick a day. Here in our everyday lives, our calendars fill up during this season of concerts, parties, and sporting events. Each one has a day and time. But Jesus told us that He will come again to this earth, and no one will know the day or time. We also do not know the day we will meet the Lord face to face in heaven. However, Jesus does remind us that the day is drawing sooner each day we live. Today is the day to get ready to meet Jesus.
2. Get the house ready. These days find us putting up Christmas trees, pulling out special traditional decorations that have meaning for our families. And in the midst of that, Jesus reminds us to get our own selves ready to meet him. He tells us in John 14 that He is making a home ready for us, preparing a room for when we meet him.
3. Get cleaned up. Whether that is the house or yourself, this season of Advent gives us a chance to make things right with those we have harmed. John the Baptist reminds us that repentance is in order, a change in the way we live, to see how Jesus is working in your life.
4. Choose your clothing. Not only for the party but to put on the clothing that Christ Jesus has for us. Paul outlines in Colossians 3 what we are to be wearing as we follow Jesus and His way home. **Put on then as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. (Col 3:12-14)**
5. Finally, a travel plan – how to get there. We just plug an address into our phone maps and the directions pop up as the quickest or shortest. To get to our heavenly home, there is only ONE WAY – to believe in the One whom God has sent, for Jesus, God's Son, tells us, **"I AM the WAY, the TRUTH, and the LIFE. No one comes to the Father except through me."** (John 14:6)

Are you getting ready to go home? Are you getting ready for Christ to come again? The day may catch us as a surprise, but I am praying we are all ready when the Lord appears. See You in Worship,

The meeting was opened by Pastor Shelly with scripture and prayer. The following was discussed. The choir is working on the Christmas Cantata. The choir will also be joining their voices with the Methodist Church choir during the Thanksgiving Eve service which will be hosted by Grace Lutheran this year.

- November 5th will be All Saints Sunday, and we will be recognizing all members of the community that have gone to the Church Eternal. Candles will be set up in the back of the church for people to light in memory of a loved one, as well as on the alter to be lit during the service in memory of those who have died in the last year.
- November 12th Pastor David Michael Carrillo, who is a musical missionary to Latvia will be joining us and taking part in worship at both services.

Lori and Jen reported that Luther league raked leaves this past week for people around Jackson Center. Luther League plans to purchase Christmas gifts for two families this year. They are raising money by hosting a bake sale on November 22, 2023 during the Community Thanksgiving Eve worship and will be serving breakfast again on December 3. Cradle Roll Ministry currently has 4 babies and are using the new material from Spark Publishing.
