They were eyewitnesses to Jesus' resurrection from the dead. Those followers of Jesus who had spent time with him were eyewitnesses to His crucifixion and resurrection. They saw him and heard him. Yet, Jesus says to us (and said to his disciple Thomas), Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed. John 20:29

You are blessed by Jesus because you have not seen yet believe that Jesus of Nazareth is God's chosen one (the Christ), your Savior and Lord. Jesus' first disciples continued to witness to God's amazing power and Life given to each one who puts their trust in Christ. They continued to witness to his forgiveness and how he changes lives (repentance). The off-site location for this instruction would be at the Community Life Center.

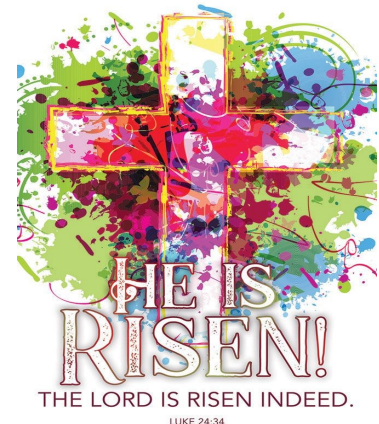

Education Committee : Education Committee Meeting as held February 12, 2024. The meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor Shelly. The Secretary's report was approved as read from the November 13, 2023, meeting. The Treasurer's report had not been updated from the last meeting.

The Youth Sunday School Report was given, and the attendance has been steady/average. It was discussed that post cards should be ordered and sent to the youth that are Grace members who have not been in attendance as a welcome back. The post cards could also be sent to area youth who are not members as a friendly invitation to come check out the youth fellowship at Grace. The Catechism Report was given by Pastor Shelly. The students have just finished learning about The Lord's Prayer. They are now working on a prayer workshop and studying parts of worship. Confirmation will take place on May 5, 2024, at the 10:30 a.m. service with Maycee Kipker and Brendan Serr being confirmed.

The Adult Education Report was given by Pastor Shelly. The Adult Sunday School class recently finished studying the 10 Commandments and has started a Bible study titled, "By the Will of God" A Nine-Session Bible Study on the Book of Ephesians by the Rev. Drs. Amy C. Little and Steven E. King. It was also reported that a new NALC Life to Life Discipleship experience has started.

Gospel Gang was discussed and it was stated that 11 children attended the last meeting on February 2, 2024. Some of the youth brought friends to participate in the learning and fellowship.

There was some discussion about reviving the Kids of the Kingdom children's choir. This was tabled until the next Education Meeting in May.

Discussion about the Tanzania trip took place with the final training date for those attending the trip to be on March 17th from 3-6pm. The Appreciation banquet will take place on March 3rd from 4:00 to 6:30 pm. So far we have about 20 people committed to go. Pastor Ibrahim and Pastor Wayne will be speaking about the Tanzania Ministry and the students we have been sponsoring. A complimentary meal will be served along with a Tanzania dish.

The annual pork meal will be this Sunday, February 25th and the donations will go towards assisting in the funds for those attending the mission trip to Tanzania. Pastor Robb Carr took sponsorship of the student Joshua, so now we only need to find sponsorship for Danny; however, because of generous donations we can financially cover Danny for the time being. Pastor Wayne will meet with Trinity Endowment Fund representative about the grant funds we have received. Pastor Wayne will present the Tanzania Ministry on April 7th to the Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church in Springfield and he will also be presenting and doing a workshop at the NALC meeting on May 4th.

In August of 2025 at the NALC Convocation in Pittsburgh, PA, both global workers have been invited. NALC will see if they can pay for 1 or both of their expenses, and OPG will in partnership with pastor Carol Fryer arrange for presentations and meetings at interested churches specifically in Ohio and elsewhere as needed.

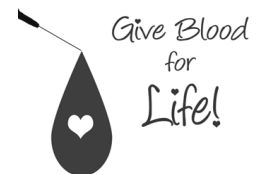

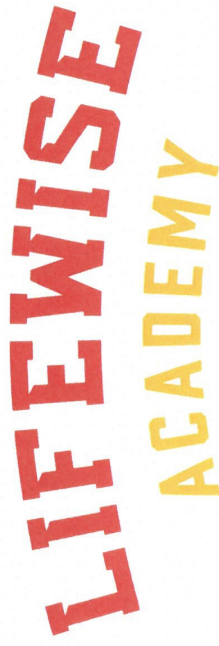
