We have a number of special services this month. They include our All-Saints service November 5th, where we remember the saints who have gone before us and the promises of God. We find comfort for our loved ones and ourselves that for all who trust in Jesus, death is not the last word but eternal life with Him. Wednesday November 22, Grace is hosting our Community Thanksgiving service with a joint choir, and participants from other area churches.

In this article I want to primarily focus upon the services on Sunday November 12th. Pastor David Michael Carrillo from Gentle Wind Ministries International and the Spiritual Orphans Network (SON Ministries) will be with us. He is a Musicianary serving in Latvia and other former Soviet Countries. These are countries where the Soviets spent decades trying to drive out the Christian influence and our Lord is at work bringing Christian renewal and hope to the area. God has gifted him with the ability to use music to share the gospel of Jesus with others. He will also share the challenges and opportunities to serve the Lord with ADHD and other learning disabilities. The theme of the message will be "Who Me, Lord?" He will also be sharing during the Sunday School about his mission ministry in detail. This will include what it means to do ministry in this hot spot. Belarus, with a puppet government aligned with Russia, is the only country between Latvia and the Ukraine. Latvia has had to close the borders with Russia and Belarus because of the threat of people crossing the border without the best interest of Latvia in mind. Israel and the conflict there is further south and that threat also is affecting the region. It should be a wonderful opportunity to learn about what our Lord Jesus is doing in a region fraught with challenges and yet filled with opportunities to share the Love of Christ with the people. There will be a free-will love offering taken to support this ministry.

Meeting Minutes

October 15, 2023

The October 15, 2023, quarterly congregational meeting was called to order by President John Pence. There were 40 members present. John opened the meeting with prayer.

Linda Jenkins, Joyce Regula, and Kathy Klopfenstein provided their NALC Convocation Reports. They all felt it was a great experience.

The Secretary's report from July 16, 2023, was approved as presented. Abby Pence moved and Seth Regula seconded a motion to approve the secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurer, Bert Regula, presented the quarterly treasurer's report as well. Bert indicated that we are currently financially strong. Receipts for the 3rd quarter totaled \$48,347.31. Expenses for the 3rd quarter totaled \$52,975.18. The balance for the end of the 3rd quarter was \$56,722.09. The balance of the mutual fund at the end of the 3rd quarter was \$71,477.47. The year-to-date receipts were \$186,276.81 and the year-to-date expenses were \$183,503.66. Kent Leininger moved and Joe Sponseller seconded a motion to approve the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Old Business:

- Update on Fresh Eyes for Mission – Pastor Bert gave us an update. Banners were purchased and hot dogs and water were distributed at a soccer game.

New Business:

- Present the ballot, any additions/nominations. There were no additions or nominations.
- Ballot Approval. Bert Regula moved and Linda Jenkins seconded a motion to approve the ballot. Motion carried.
- Holiday Services – December 24th, 25th, and 31st.

Pamphlets on the Tanzania Orphanage and Outreach Ministry, along with a cover letter from Pastor Bert, is being sent out to all churches in the NALC. The 2024 Mission trip to Tanzania is open for registration. Currently there are 4 people registered, and the maximum amount of people that can go are 19. The meeting will be November 15th. The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.
